


THE GOLDEN WARRIOR LAWRENCE JAMES ABACUS, 2005` (ONE COPY)

During the 1920s—in the aftermath of the Arab revolt against Britain—T. E. Lawrence gained global attention, both for his involvement in the Middle Eastern anti-imperialist movement, and for his vivid and sensational writings about his experiences. Following World War I, his appointment as an advisor to Winston Churchill—nearly simultaneous with the release of an American documentary about the revolt—further charged the T. E. Lawrence mania. Despite the emergence of a whole new set of problems in the Middle East, and fueled by the classic status of the epic movie *Lawrence of Arabia*, the T. E. Lawrence mystique continues to fascinate. Controversial and provocative, this revised and updated edition of Lawrence James's acclaimed biography penetrates and overturns the mythology that surrounds T. E. Lawrence.

UNDER THE WIGS THE MEMOIRS OF A LEGAL KING-MAKER SYDNEY AYLETT EYRE METHUEN, 1978 (ONE COPY)

Sydney Aylett entered the Temple as a junior barristers' clerk at seven shillings a week. He served his mistress, the Law, faithfully for the next 58yrs, from 1928 as chief clerk to No. 4 Paper Buildings. This is his frank and often amusing memoir of this life. As a clerk he came into daily contact with the famous and infamous. His job made him a virtual kingmaker; his was a major decision in the choice of barristers to join his chambers, he directed their careers by attracting and selecting briefs and negotiated the fees. The author provides affectionate portraits, warts and all, of distinguished barristers represented.







The second edition of Comparative Constitutional Law updates the first edition by including material on important recent developments. The second edition expands the treatment "dialogic" forms of judicial review, presenting material on the British Human Rights Act, and recent scholarly analyses of these forms of review. It incorporates a substantial discussion of the treatment of emergencies in the world's constitutional systems, focusing on the extent to which constitutions regulate government operations in emergencies by requiring executives to obtain authorization from legislatures or, in contrast, do so through direct judicial supervision of executive action.
